

Ideas for Painted Inspirational Rocks

■ Personal Uses

- Daily Inspiration: Keep one on a desk, nightstand, or coffee table as a daily reminder of hope, peace, or strength.
- Mindfulness Tool: Use during meditation, prayer, or reflection to ground and center oneself.

- Fundraisers: Sell painted rocks at school events to support local causes.

■■ Community Engagement

- Kindness Rocks Trails: Place rocks along walking paths, in parks, or near community centers for people to discover.
